## Mallya likely to Move European Court of Human Rights Soon

UK HC's order allowing his extradition to India is in violation of certain human rights ECHR protects

Mumbai: Vijay Mallya is likely to approach the European Court of Human Rights (ECHR) as the 28-day period post the rejection of his appeal against an extradition order in the UK Supreme Court comes to an end soon.

While the ECHR is yet to officially receive an application from Mallya, top lawyers close to him say the move is imminent, as the recent UK High Court's judgement allowing his extradition to India is in violation of certain human rights that the ECHR protects. The UK is a signatory to ECHR.

A government source told ET that they suspect Mallya has availed all the options available. "We suspect the delay by the UK home office to sign the extradition order is owing to an application filed by Mallya either to seek asylum (in UK) or he has moved the ECHR. Since there has not been any official communication we aren't aware which one of the two remedies he has availed," said the official. "There is also a possibility that he could have availed both the routes," added the official.

Replying to the query sent by The Economic Times, Denis Lambert, press officer, ECHR said "I just can't tell you that the Court has not received, for the time being, any request for a Rule 39 interim measure on behalf of Vijay Mallya."

An e-mail sent to the Indian High Commission in UK remained unanswered until press time. On May 27, ET had reported that Mallya could have sought asylum in the UK.

Legal experts told ET that the embattled businessman's plea before ECHR can be filed for breach of Article 3 (prohibition of torture), Article 5 (Right to liberty & security) and Article 6 (Right to a fair trial).

"However, this option has to be availed before UK Home Office of minister Priti Patel certifies the extradition order," said a legal expert familiar with the developments.

According to recent media reports, the British High Commission cited a "confidential legal issue" that has surfaced during the extradition process. Mallya's extradition was due soon after the loss of his appeal in the UK High Court challenging a 2018 order of extradition on the request of Indian authorities before the Supreme Court.

Pavani Reddy legal director Clyde & Co London said "Logically and legally at this point of time, the only confidential legal issues cited by the UK High Commission could be asylum and human rights."

## TN Mulls Setting up Drone Body

CHENNAI Tamil Nadu is exploring the possibility of setting up a Drone Corporation to make the state a drone manufacturing hub, said an official statement. The state plans to have the hub using the drone technology developed by Anna University. A meeting to this effect was held with stakeholders on Wednesday under the chairmanship of State Development Policy Council Vice Chairman C. Ponnaiyan. Drones have wide scope for use in various sectors such as agriculture, disaster management, health, forest and wildlife, education, urban development, traffic management, mining and others. A presentation was made by M. Annadurai, Vice President, Tamil Nadu State Council for Science and Technology and a former senior official of Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO). - IANS

## Three States Deploy Rly Coaches for Covid Backup

New Delhi: Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Telangana have stationed rail coaches turned into isolation units for Covid-19 patients at select locations. This comes as confirmed Covid-19 cases in India inch closer to the 3 lakh mark.

Uttar Pradesh has finalised 24 stations for deployment of these coaches, while Telangana has asked for coaches to be stationed at three stations, and Delhi state government has asked for coaches to be stationed at one railway station as yet - Shakurbasti.

The Indian Railways has already allocated these coaches to states. Ten coaches, with a capacity of accommodating 16 patients each, have been stationed at each location.

"As per guidelines of ministry of health and family welfare (MoHFW), few state governments have sent the requisition to Indian Railways," the railway ministry said in a statement on Thursday.

Indian Railways is prepared to provide 5,231 Covid Care Centres, which zonal Railways have converted to be used as quarantine facilities.

# Export Queries Up, Cos Worried of Rising Costs

Labour-intensive sectors struggling with rising labour costs amid social distancing norms

New Delhi: Exporters have seen a 20% rise in export enquiries in the last fortnight from the US, Australia and Japan. While cotton yarn is being exported at a 15-20% discount especially to China, exporters of handicraft, jewellery and shoes have got significant enquiries from the EU.

However, labour-intensive sectors such as gems and jewellery are apprehensive about the sharp rise in orders as they grapple with rising labour costs amid social distancing norms.

The 13th edition of Indian Fashion Jewellery & Accessories Fair, which was organised by the Export Promotion Council of Handicrafts (EPCH) as a virtual fair from June 1-4, saw around 1,200 overseas buyers from 81 countries.

"Serious enquiries worth ₹150 crore were generated, which are likely to convert to actual deals," said Rakesh Kumar, director general of EPCH.

Cancellation of orders had resulted in India's merchant-

se exports contracting a sharp 60% from a year earlier to \$10.36 billion in April. The government expects the contraction in exports in May to be 30-35%. Commerce and industry minister Piyush Goyal recently said that exports in June could be on a par with June 2019 or 8-10% less.

"Exploratory enquiries are happening and there is almost a 20% rise in them in the last few weeks with the US, Australia and Japan contributing to most," said Ajay Sahal, director general, Federation of Indian Export Organisations.

Sanjay Jain, chairman of ICC National Expert Committee on Textiles, said yarn exports are happening but at 15% lower rates than in the pre-Covid-19 days. "China is buying from India and there are enquiries from the EU and Bangladesh. Cotton prices have fallen and the old orders, which got cancelled, have now been renegotiated at new prices," Jain said. However, labour-intensive sectors such as gems and jewellery are unsure of a sharp rise in exports as social distancing norms kick in driving up labour costs. The anti-China factor is also adding the higher number of enquiries with exporters terming the ongoing Covid-19 crisis as an opportunity to promote India at the expense of China and benefit from the anti-China sentiment globally.

"The US and EU have reactivated their orders as they look at alternative sourcing destinations. However, not much new business has come in," said Council for Leather Exports chairman Aqeel Ahmed Panaruna.

New Delhi: A high-level Empowered Group of Secretaries (EGoS), to be chaired by the cabinet secretary, will draw up a plan to drive a Phased Manufacturing Plan or PMP and incentive schemes to attract investment in at least eight sectors such as mobile and electronics manufacturing, medical devices and pharmaceuticals.

The group will also supervise opening-up challenge route for states to compete for marquee investors and projects, the government said in a notification.

The group will "provide support and facilitation to investors for investing in India and to boost growth in key sectors of the economy" and "create an investment-friendly and business-conducive ecosystem to drive investment growth in India". The government has set up the group whose members are NITI Aayog CEO and Secretaries

of Departments for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Commerce, Economic Affairs and Revenue, after a Cabinet decision last week. The challenge route for states to compete for investors and projects including public sector projects entails ranking of states on investment attractiveness using parameters such as Ease of Doing Business indicators, land availability and affordability. Incentives that are being provided from state budget, attractive land policy, policy predictability, special packages being offered for promotion of backward areas and speed of clearances, among others.

The group will identify key focus-sectors to drive development on a significant scale and import substitution, examine and suggest ways to attract more foreign direct investment (FDI) in green-field projects, and promote Make in India through indigenous procurement.

## Decline in Output Already Accounted for This Year: CEA

New Delhi: Chief economic advisor K Subramanian on Thursday said "decline in output" is part of the government's working assumptions for the current year, which also includes a possible recovery in the second half of this year or next year.

Global credit rating agency S&P keeping India's rating unchanged with a stable outlook has cleared the path for the country for inclusion of its bonds in the Global Sovereign Bond indices. Subramanian said at a virtual press conference. "I think this year the growth being very low and...a decline in output is something that is part of our working assumptions," he said.

At the same time, the recovery possibly in the second half of the year or next year was also part of the government's baseline expectations, Subramanian said.

This is the first time that a government official has admitted to a likely contraction in the country's output after the Reserve Bank of India's assessment. The central bank had in its assessment said the Indian economy will contract in FY21, but did not give an estimate.

Private economists, multilateral organisations and rating agencies have projected contraction ranging from 3.5% to 5%, with a rebound next fiscal.

India's economy grew by 4.2% in FY20. The finance ministry, Subramanian said, is working on a large range of growth estimates for this year and recovery in second half or next year is also part of baseline expectation.

He said the ministry had in April, which was just weeks in to lockdown, estimated GDP growth at 1.5-2% in the current fiscal on anticipation of a V-shaped recovery.
